Christmas Traditions and Luciadagen--December 11th 2004

The Sankta Lucia Day, and the procession and ceremony accompanying it, has long been an important pre-Christmas tradition to Swedes around the world. Here in Houston, The Swedish Club tries its best to bring a little of that special day to the citizens of our community. Every year we select a young lady from our club membership to wear the Lucia crown during our pageant and to represent the club at a heritage festival in Barkeryd, Småland, Sweden in August the following summer. SAS co-sponsors our Lucia's trip by providing the club with a reduced airfare ticket. This year's Lucia is Frida Sellman, a recent graduate of Trinity University where she received her Bachelor and Masters degree in accounting. She is the daughter of Eric and Eva Sellman.

Our Christmas Traditions and Lucia procession is scheduled for Saturday, December 11, 2004 from 3:00 PM to 6:00 PM at St. Andrew Lutheran Church, 1353 Witte Road, Houston, TX 77055.

The event includes a short church service, during which the Lucia leads her procession of female attendants and star boys down the aisle to the musical strains of "Santa Lucia, the Neapolitan Boat Song". This year the attendants and star boys will be singing some traditional Swedish songs, thanks to the leadership of Eva Sellman.

After the service, we will gather in the gymnasium to socialize and enjoy some traditional Luciadag refreshments. These will include, but are not limited to, Lussekatter (saffron flavored buns), Pepparkakor (ginger

cookies), Lingonsaft (lingonberry flavored drink), and coffee.

Also during the reception the Scandinavian Folkdancers of Houston have graciously agreed to perform some traditional Scandinavian folkdances. And there will be storytelling about the Jultomte and dancing and singing around the Christmas tree. In addition, our annual Christmas bazaar will be open in the gymnasium before, during and after the ceremony. Scandinavian gift and folk items will be available for purchase. What a great way to finish (or start!) your Christmas shopping.



The club is looking for girls and boys to participate at attendants and star boys. Female attendants must be between the ages of 5 and 20 and star boys must be between 5 and 15.

Attendants wear all white clothing with silver trim and accessories. The club will provide the trim and accessories, and is able to provide some articles of clothing, but anyone having their own outfit is encouraged to wear it. My name is Frida Sellman. I am a recent graduate from Trinity University where I received my Bachelor and Masters in Accounting. I work at Grant Thornton as an Assurance Associate and plan to pursue my C.P.A (certified public accountant license) upon completing my first tax season.

I was born the 27th of February 1981, in a little small town north of Gothenburg. Both of my parents went to University in Gothenburg and they wanted their children to grow up in this town. In 1982, my father accepted a job in Oslo, Norway. Our time in Norway was very brief as my father was transferred to Kuwait. Over the next twelve years we moved five more times, first to Saudi Arabia, then Bahrain, then to Stockholm, then England and finally Houston. We never did make it back to Gothenburg other then for vacation.

My sister and I did learn English in school but we always spoke Swedish at home. It was very important for my parents that we continue our Swedish traditions even though we lived abroad. My mother would organize Lucia-processions at our schools and a Swedish "jul-tomte" would visit our home on Christmas Eve. In England our family were very active members of SVEA and I participated in the Lucia procession every year.

In the Woodlands our family is very involved with a Lutheran church. In high school, I organized a Lucia procession with the youth group since there are several individuals with Swedish heritage. This year I am teaching Swedish I at Ikea for the Swedish Club. (if anyone is interested in attending its at 7.00 p.m. on Mondays)

Although I have only spent three years in Sweden, I have grown up with Swedish traditions and understand the importance of the Lucia celebration and I am honored to represent the Swedish Club of Houston in Barkeryd.



Joint Swedish Meeting Explores New Embassy Building in DC

Mr. Peter Wahlqvist, the Cultural Counselor for the Swedish Embassy in Washington DC, was in Houston and met with a joint Swedish group under the auspices of SACC, SWEA, the Consulate, and the Swedish Club*.

Mr. Wahlquist has a degree from the University of Lund. He has worked at the National Theatre in Göteborg and served as freelance director at the Royal Dramatic Theatre and the City Theatres of Stockholm, Göteborg, Malmö, and Helsingborg as well as Swedish Television. Before his appointment as a Cultural Counselor to the Embassy of Sweden in Washington, DC in 2003, he worked in several networks of European Union on different cultural issues.

IKEA's restaurant was the caterer for some delicious Swedish snacks to fuel the reception. Just to prove it was Houston, IKEA included some stuffed "mild Jalapeños". Then we retired to a large classroom to see and hear Mr. Wahlquist's description of the new Swedish Embassy Building.

Currently the Embassy is in a rented space in a building on Embassy Row at 15th & M Streets.



There's no room to show the Flag or do any walkup promotions.

The new Embassy will be on the Promenade on the Potomac River banks. It will be opened near Labor Day in 2006.

The design was chosen by a tough competition. "Basically, our building is a modernistic glass construction, which is encompassed by an intricate belt of wood character. The combination of an exterior cladding of screened glass with a layer of wood veneer on glass sheets behind give the building a modern, Scandinavian touch which, through its translucency, becomes a built image of that openness which Sweden would like to present to the world," *say Gert Wingårdh and Tomas Hansen, architects* **

Some of the key features described were:

A sidewalk patio where people normally walk that can promote Sweden to the common man or the students from two nearby universities.

2010 technology implemented in 2006 with high quality, large screen video phones.

An award winning website,

Windows that double as video screens toward the busy streets,
